EXECUTIVE ORDER IMPOSING A CURFEW

WHEREAS, events occurring throughout the United States and within the Commonwealth of Kentucky may cause civil unrest requiring preparation, planning and management by Louisville Metro Government in order to respond to any event or situation that occurs as a result of any such events;

WHEREAS, as a result of the potential for civil unrest to occur at and subsequent to the announcement by the Attorney General I declared a Second State of Emergency due to the potential civil unrest in Executive Order 2020-014;

WHEREAS, enacting curfews is fundamental during periods of civil unrest to avoid unlawful assemblies, enhance public safety and prevent potential property damage and looting;

WHEREAS, it is my hope that this Order can be rescinded in short order or otherwise left to expire due to the absence of unlawful assemblies and otherwise unlawful conduct; and


WHEREAS, KRS 39A.180 and KRS 39A.100 vests the Chief Executive Officer of a consolidated local government with the authority to issue executive orders necessary for disaster and emergency response purposes and to supplement the execution of KRS Chapters 39A and 39B.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Greg Fischer, as Mayor of Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government, pursuant to KRS Chapters 39A and 39B of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and Executive Order 2020-014, HEREBY DECLARE THE IMPOSITION OF A CURFEW within Louisville Metro related to the well-being of our citizens and businesses due to the potential unrest. That that end, pursuant to the powers granted me by KRS 39A.100(2)(b), 39A.100(2)(c), and 39B.070, I hereby ORDER AND DIRECT THE FOLLOWING:

1. That commencing at 9:00 pm September 23, 2020, and for the following 72 hours, I am imposing a curfew on Louisville Metro. All individuals shall return to their residences and remain off of all common areas, including but not limited to streets, parks,

right of ways, and other public spaces between 9:00 pm and 6:30 am the following morning;

2. This Order shall not apply to individuals who are commuting to a place of work, house of worship for services or seeking medical attention for themselves or others; and
3. This curfew shall remain in effect until September 26, 2020 at 6:30 am at which time this Order will be re-evaluated.
