SAFETY AT SCHOOL

If you, or someone else, is afraid of being hurt TELL:

- a teacher
- the school police
- a parent
- a school nurse
- an adult you trust
- **CALL 911**

SAFETY AT HOME

CALL 911 and ask for the police if you are afraid that you or someone else in your home will be hurt.

Tell the police **WHERE** you are and give the address.

Tell the police **WHO** is being hurt, and who is involved.

Practice **HOW TO GET OUT OF YOUR HOME SAFELY**. Which doors, windows, or stairs would be best?

Which neighbor can you go to for help?

REMEMBER: YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO BE SAFE!

Ask your school to help each person write a **SAFETY PLAN!** The plan should help each person decide what they would do if they were in danger. Write down **who** you would talk to, **where** you would go, and where else you might be able to **get help**. You need to be familiar with your own neighborhood.

YOU CAN HELP YOURSELF BE SAFE!

SAFETY ON THE STREET

If you are afraid of being hurt:

Go to the nearest store and ask them to **CALL 911**.

or

CALL 911 from a pay phone.

or

If there is no phone or store nearby, **SCREAM** as loud as you can

and

GET AWAY.
