



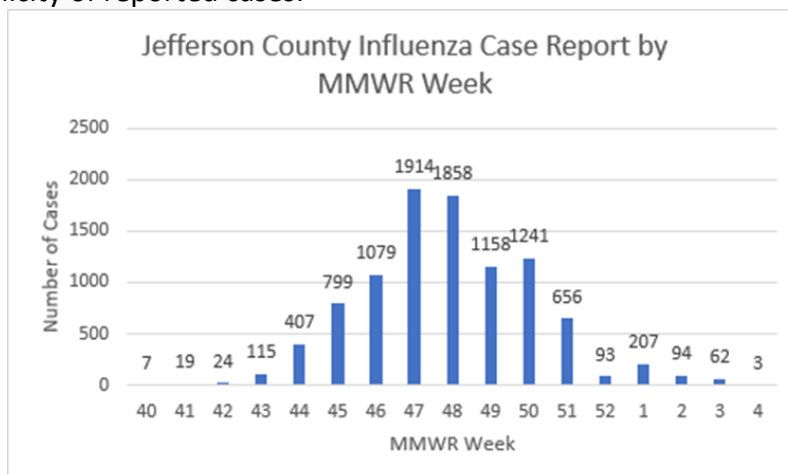

**Subject:** February Director’s Report - Trends and Insights from 12/30/22 – 1/26/23

- **Data modernization.** LMPHW has a fully executed contract with Medicalistics for an electronic health records system. The project team is meeting weekly with the vendor to move forward with a swift implementation of the maximally beneficial product for all LMPHW programs with patient care components.
- **Flood recovery and building restoration.** The second and third floors of 400 E. Gray St. remains closed due to flood damage. Asbestos removal is underway currently. Once complete, quotes for the additional work will be finalized and contractors will be scheduled. Replacement work on the first floor and basement will begin once the upper floors are fully operational for staff and visitors.
- **New administration.** The Senior Directors Team held our first meetings with Deputy Mayor George and Mayor Greenberg focused on broad program overviews. Highlights from the Mayor’s transition team’s report were shared with us as well. It is expected to be made available to the public in the coming weeks.
- **Flu surveillance.** Seasonal flu activity continues but is declining locally and across the [country](#). Louisville’s largest wastewater treatment center shows continued decline in Flu A and no Flu B. A total of 9,736 laboratory-confirmed influenza cases have been reported in Jefferson County season to date. The weekly flu activity report now includes data on the race and ethnicity of reported cases.
