These organizations offer services that assist individuals apply for disability-based benefits or participate in work incentive programs.

Center for Accessible Living

Offers access to Community Work Incentives Coordinators (CWICs). CWICs assist Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, family members, and professionals with the following: information on medical benefits, Social Security, Transitional Assistance, assistive Housing, Workers Compensation, and more personalized work incentive planning, assistance information about how working will affect benefits, and ongoing assistance with general issues concerning benefits.

Kentucky Relay Service

Telecommunications Relay Service that relays calls between deaf, hard of hearing, or speech impaired individuals who use a TTY, CapTel, or VCO to communicate on the telephone. TRS is a 24 hour-a-day, seven-day-a-week service, allowing the consumer to "talk" to anyone, anytime, anywhere without having to worry about communication barriers. Video Relay Services (VRS) are also available, allowing consumers using American Sign Language to communicate in their native language through video interpreters.
