

NEED HELP WITH YOUR HEATING BILLS?

APPLY NOW FOR LIHEAP BENEFITS



The LIHEAP Crisis Program is administered by Louisville Metro Community Services to provide utility assistance for income-eligible residents who are in danger of disconnection from their utilities or who have received an eviction notice if utilities are included in the resident's rent.

Appointments can be scheduled, in person only, at all three locations listed below on the following schedule:

Mondays through Thursdays • 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

On Fridays, appointments can be scheduled at the Central and South Offices • 8 a.m. – 1 p.m.

(Note: The East Office is closed on Fridays.)

To schedule an appointment, visit one of the LIHEAP locations and bring 1) your most recent LG&E bill (must be a brown, disconnect notice); or an eviction notice from your landlord if your utilities are included in your rent, and 2) a photo ID (if available). All applicants must be Jefferson County residents with a household income within 130% of the federal poverty guidelines.
