
The 2001 Volunteer Jamboree in Atlanta, GA


We will soon be wrapping up this recycling drive!


While the "official" drive is over, we encourage all sites to continue to collect the tabs and turn them into RSVP through the end of January.

Betty's commitment inspires and recruits all ages of volunteers even though she has a regular cast of RSVP volunteers who serve.





This trip includes more than just a bus ride!





Social Security also has a fraud line at 1-800-269-0271.

Another tip - have copies of the front and back of all credit cards in another location or with a trustworthy relative so you can call the customer service numbers and file a report if necessary.

Protect your "identity" from thieves and limit your liability for charges.






