| II. Major Justice Initiatives/Strategic Priorities | Status |
| Laura and John Arnold Foundation (LJAF) Pretrial Demo Site | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Current local projects include: Felony Case Processing Pilot; Jail Population Management Dashboard; Barcode e-Citation; Court Notification Study; and Criminal Justice Data Warehouse. • MCJC staff participating on DoIT Xjail Tiger Team to address necessary modifications in Xjail that impact the dashboard. Demos with members of the judiciary to be scheduled upon completion of dashboard modifications. • MCJC staff presented a demo on the Jail Population Management Dashboard to LJAF judicial education symposium in Miami in December 2015. |
| Dual Diagnosis Cross-Functional Team (DDCFT) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working with members to develop 2016 Legislative Priorities and advocacy items. • DDCFT Task Groups—HMIS Technology working with UofL School of Public Health on Evaluation Component/Data Collection Plan; finalizing HMIS modifications and revisions of MOU for information sharing. Public Safety Protocols working on development of a Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) Pilot to provide an additional pre-booking diversion pathway for law enforcement officers to refer low-level drug users to community-based treatment and support services. |

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| III. Ordinance-Based Committee Staff Support | Status |
| Domestic Violence Prevention Coordinating Council (DVPCC) (January 28, 2016) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Last met in October. Representatives from University of Louisville, Criminal Justice Department will present preliminary findings at the January meeting from a telephone survey conducted to assess citizen knowledge of dynamics of domestic violence and available services in the community. Council also studying feasibility of conducting a safety audit/assessment of current domestic violence case processing that would include recommendations for system improvement. Fatality Review Committee presented the 2013-2014 Report to the DVPCC at the October meeting. |
| Citizens Commission on Police Accountability (CCPA) (February 2, 2016) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The committee reconvened January 19, 2016 to discuss a new LMPD case. |

| Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee (JJAC) (March 3, 2016) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Maria Gurren, Public Protection Coordinator, hired by LMYDS and detailed to the MCJC to support the work of the JJAC. JJAC Executive Committee will meet on February 4, 2016 to review work plan and initial findings of the Detention Utilization Study (DUS). |

| 2014 Port Security Grant (September 2014 - August 2016) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Equipment and planning projects for area first responders to enhance security and response at the Port of Louisville. |
| 2014 Justice & Mental Health Collaboration Grant (October 2014 - September 2016) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continuation funding for existing Enhanced Supervision Docket/Mental Health Court and creation of a new docket utilizing ACT for participants that require a higher level of supervision and services to be successful. |
| 2015 Second Chance Act Reentry Program Grant for Individuals with Co-Occurring Substance Abuse and Mental Disorders (October 2015 - September 2017) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Project goal is to improve outcomes and reduce recidivism for adults with co-occurring substance abuse and mental health disorders through screening/assessment of incarcerated individuals and provision of appropriate evidence-based pre- and post-release services and treatment. Will include a more comprehensive transition from jail to community-based services for program participants that do not meet the definition of SPMI and also have substance abuse disorders. |
