

Medical firsts, in Louisville KY

- The "Accident Service" program, better known as the emergency room, was first introduced in 1911.
- Kentucky's first spinal cord fusion for scoliosis in 1941.
- First successful human heart transplant following the use of Thoratec device in 1985.
- The first transplant of a human hand in the U.S. was performed by Kleinert, Kutz and Associates in 1999 at Jewish Hospital.
- A. Bennett Jenson, M.D., of the James Graham Brown Cancer Center, is one of two researchers credited with developing the HPV vaccine in 2005.
- UofL Spinal Cord Injury Research Center's Scientific Director, Dr. Susan Harkema, produced redeveloped movement in patients with spinal cord injuries in 2014.



