






### Go Green, Save Green \$\$ Get Rebates on Electric Lawn Equipment

It's no secret that gas-powered lawn equipment is bad for the air. It's old technology, like driving a car without a catalytic converter, producing dirty, unfiltered emissions. In fact, one hour of mowing with a typical gas-powered lawnmower produces the same amount of smog-forming pollution as driving your car for 200 miles—enough to go from Louisville to Nashville. These emissions contribute significantly to ground-level air pollution and are especially harmful to sensitive groups such as children and the elderly.

The Louisville Metro Air Pollution Control District's Lawn Care for Cleaner Air Program encourages Louisville Metro residents to reduce these harmful lawn-related air emissions by using cleaner electric and human-powered lawn equipment.

#### Louisville Metro Residency Requirement

The Lawn Care for Cleaner Air rebate program is open only to residents of Metro Louisville/Jefferson County, Ky. You must provide a copy of your proof of residency (i.e. your driver's license) to the participating dealer when purchasing new equipment or to APCD when submitting your mail-in rebate request. Failure to do so will result in not receiving a rebate.

#### Two Ways to Get a Rebate

##### **1. Through a participating dealer. *This is the fastest way to get a lawn care rebate!***

Participating dealers give the rebates up front, as dollars off of the purchase price.

**2. Individually.** If you are purchasing your eligible equipment at a non-participating dealer, use Rebate Request Form to request a Bonus or Standard Rebate. If your rebate request meets all the requirements, you should receive your rebate within 60 days.

#### Other Conditions on Equipment Eligibility

- No rebate can exceed the purchase price of equipment.
- All eligible equipment must be purchased new or factory reconditioned.
- Trade-in equipment must be similar to the new eligible electric, reel, or battery-powered equipment that will be purchased with a Bonus Rebate (e.g., a mower for a mower, a battery for a battery).
- Only batteries used in the cordless electric equipment that is eligible for a rebate under this program will qualify for rebates. No rebate will be given for batteries used in gas-powered equipment.
- Trade-in equipment must be taken to one of the three Louisville Metro recycling centers listed below. Some participating dealers accept replacement batteries for trade/recycling when a new battery is purchased. Only the Waste Reduction Center at 636 Meriwether Avenue is currently accepting all battery types. Please call ahead to other locations for up-to-date battery-recycling information.
- Old equipment must be drained of gas and oil prior to trade-in. Drained oil may be taken to staffed recycling centers, including Metro Recycling Centers #1 and #2 listed below. Gasoline and gas/oil mixtures can be taken to the Haz Bin on Grade Lane.

#### The following Louisville Metro Recycling Centers accept trade-in equipment.

(Hours may change without notice; we suggest calling before you head out.):

- 1. Metro Recycling Center # 1, 595 Hubbards Lane.** Accepting lawn equipment year-round.  
Hours: Tuesday through Saturday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. (502) 896-1293.
- 2. Metro Recycling Center # 2, 7219 Dixie Highway.** Accepting lawn equipment March through September.  
Hours: Tue - Sat, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. (502) 933-5682.
- 3. Metro Waste Reduction Center, 636 Meriwether Ave.** Accepting lawn equipment March through September.  
Accepting batteries year-round. Hours: Wed-Fri, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sat. 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. (502) 574-2887.

**Note:** Please check your voucher for accuracy before you leave the recycling facility! After you leave the recycling center, it will be difficult to prove that you recycled something other than what is marked on the voucher. It is your responsibility to make sure the voucher is accurate.



## NEW PRICING AT THE WASTE REDUCTION CENTER

The Waste Reduction Center provides a means for all Louisville/Jefferson County residents to properly dispose of tires and household bulk waste.

Up to three household junk items may be dropped off at no charge.

If there are more than three items a fee will be charged according to this schedule:

### Waste Reduction Center Prices & Categories Effective February 1, 2016

The Waste Reduction Center is located at 636 Meriwether Avenue.

**§ 74.01 OPERATION OF BICYCLES.**

(A) No person 11 years of age or older shall operate a bicycle on the sidewalks located within the geographical boundary limits of Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government (“Louisville Metro”). Provided, however, no person, regardless of age, shall operate a bicycle on the sidewalks of Louisville Metro within the Downtown Form District, as defined in the Land Development Code for all of Louisville/Jefferson County, Kentucky, as amended.

(B) No operator of any bicycle shall carry another person on such bicycle, except as provided herein.

(1) A bicycle shall not be used to carry more persons at one time than the number for which it is designed and equipped. Riders of “tandem bicycles” all must be able to comfortably reach the pedals of the bicycle.

(2) A passenger shall ride only upon a permanent and regular seat attached to the bicycle, or to a trailer towed by the bicycle.

(3) An adult may carry a child as a passenger, provided that the child meets all of the following conditions:

(a) Is over the age of one;

(b) Weighs less than 40 pounds or is less than 40 inches in height;

(c) Is properly seated in a permanent and attached child seat or in a trailer attached to the bicycle, provided that the seat/trailer is equipped with a harness to hold the child securely to the seat, and protection is provided against the child’s feet or hands hitting the spokes of the wheels;

(d) Is able to maintain an erect, seated position on the bicycle;

(e) Is wearing an appropriately-sized helmet that is secured to the head by straps while the bicycle is being operated, or is in an enclosed bicycle trailer that protects the passenger’s head from impact in an accident; and

(f) Does not remain in the child seat or trailer when the bicycle operator is not in immediate control of the bicycle.

(C) So long as they are acting within the scope of their official duties, subsection (A) shall not apply to officers with Louisville Metro Police Department, nor to employees of Louisville Metro Emergency Medical Services, Louisville Fire and Rescue, the suburban fire protection districts, Louisville and Jefferson County Emergency Management Agency, nor to Downtown Management District Clean and Safety Team personnel, nor to private security personnel employed by hospitals located within the Downtown Form District.

**§ 74.02 OPERATION OF MOTORCYCLES, MOTORSCOOTERS AND SEGWAYS.**

(A) No operator of any motorcycle, motorscooter, power-driven bicycle, or segway shall carry another person except on a seat attached thereto or in a side car attached to the vehicle.

(B) No operator of a motorcycle, motorscooter, segway, or power-driven bicycle shall operate such vehicle in any public park, except on a roadway or in a parking area or area designated therein for said use.

(C) No operator of a motorcycle, motorscooter, segway, or power-driven bicycle shall operate such vehicle in any play lot or tot lot.

**§ 74.025 SEGWAYS.**

(A) Segways are permitted on the sidewalks of the Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government that are six feet in width or wider.

(B) No operator of a segway shall operate said device before sunrise or after sunset, as published daily in The Courier-Journal, without a head light or red tail light which conforms with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and/or Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government.

(C) No person under the age of 16 years shall operate a segway.

**§ 74.03 DESIGNATION OF BIKEWAYS.**

(A) The Director of Public Works is authorized to designate bikeways for the sole use of nonmotorized vehicles. Immediately after such designation, he or she shall cause to be posted on the bikeways signs indicating that the bikeways are for the sole use of nonmotorized vehicles. These bikeways may be either a lane separate from the paved portion of a motorized vehicle right-of-way or a separate, designated lane in a paved motorized right-of-way. The Director of Public Works shall utilize signs appropriate to each type of bikeway.

(B) No person shall operate a motorized vehicle on bikeways designated by a Metro Government engineer and posted as herein set out. However, motorized maintenance vehicles of Metro Government are excepted from this provision.


