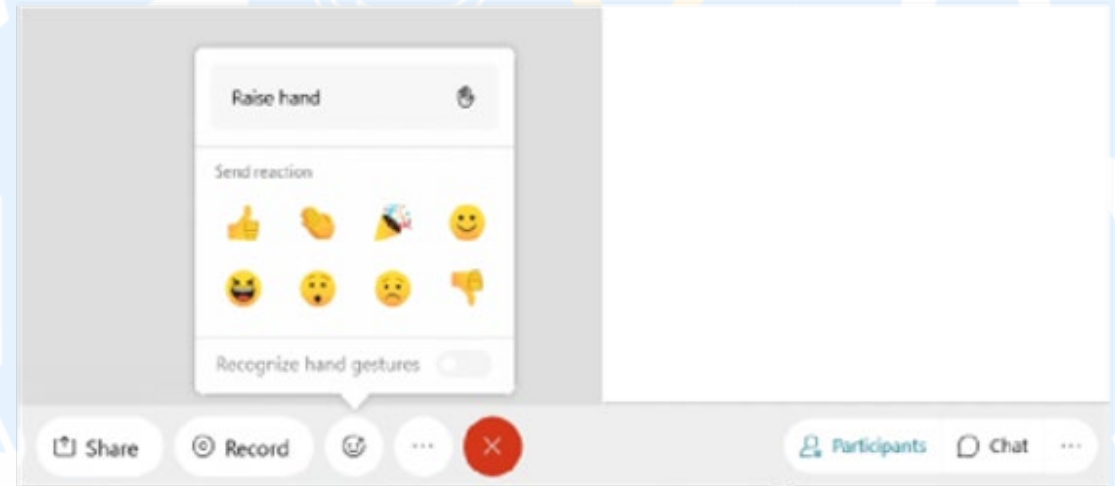

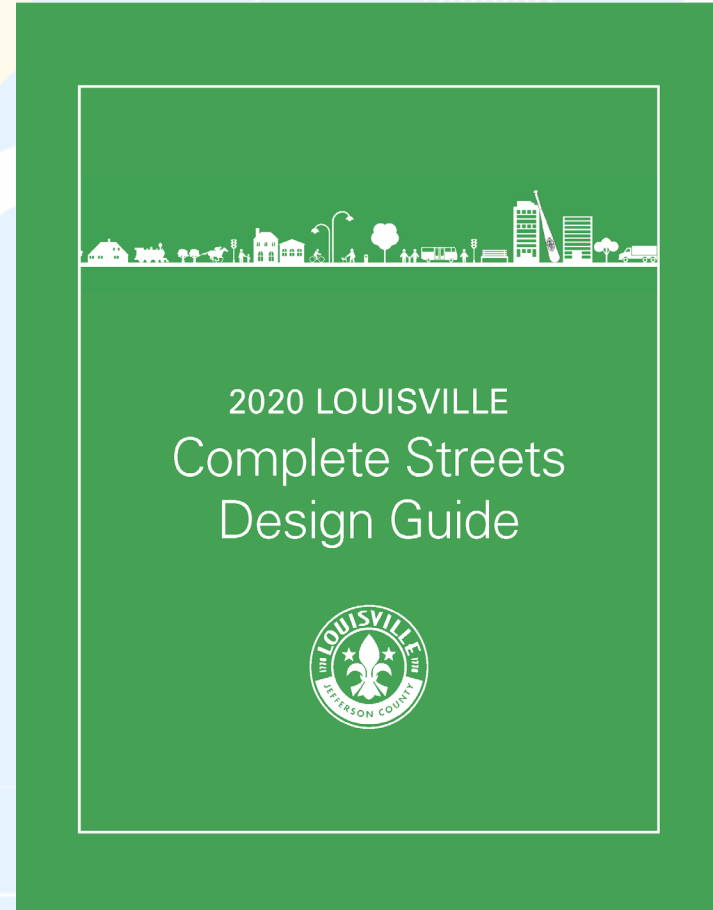

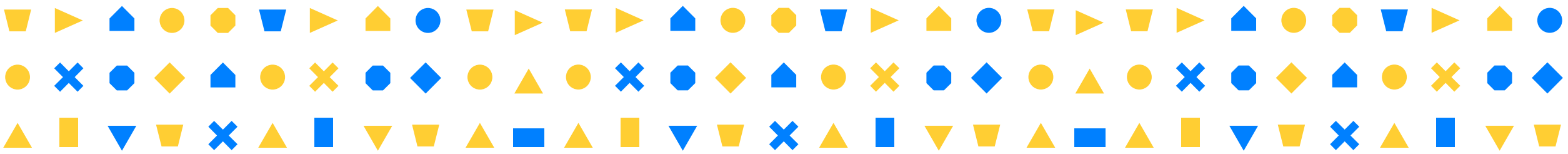

Complete Streets Coalition

- 15 inaugural members appointed by Public Works Committee
- Will serve 2- or 3-year terms
- First meeting expected in November
- Must review public development proposals using a Complete Streets Checklist
- \$500,000 in Metro funding for traffic calming and Complete Streets improvements on Minor Arterials and Local Roads to be approved by Complete Streets Coalition.
 - Must prioritize investment in low-income areas.

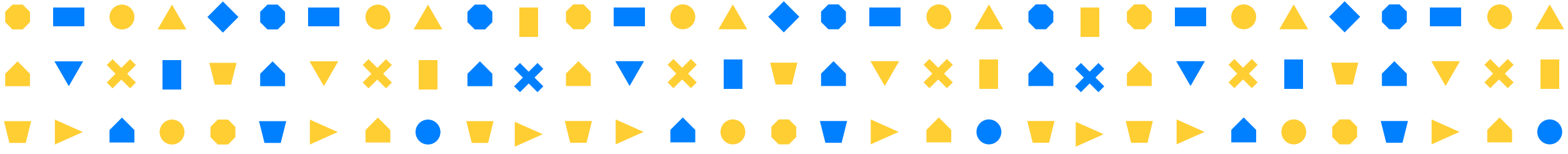

Considerations for Federal Grants

- **Funding for capital projects that will help us reach Vision Zero**
 - Good fit for projects costing over \$1,000,000
- **Local Match**
 - We must cover 20% of total project cost (\$200,000+)
 - Overmatching will make you more competitive for discretionary grants
- **Merit Criteria**
 - **What will be a competitive submission?**
 - General themes:
 - Project Readiness
 - Safety
 - Equity ([Justice 40](#))
 - At least 40% of the benefits from federal investments to disadvantaged communities
 - Environmental Sustainability
 - Quality of Life
 - Improved Mobility and Community Connectivity
 - Economic Competitiveness and Opportunity
 - State of Good Repair
 - Partnership and Collaboration
 - Innovation
 - Environmental Risk



Important Terms

- **Discretionary** Very formal application, compete nationwide/statewide, winners chosen by elected leaders or their appointees
 - **Formula** Less formal application, compete statewide/amongst other KIPDA local public agencies, often chosen by committees that Metro has a vote (ex: KIPDA TPC)
 - **NOFO** Notice of Funding Opportunity
 - **FFY** Federal Fiscal Year (Begins October 1)
 - **US DOT** United States Department of Transportation
 - **FHWA** Federal Highway Administration
 - **FTA** Federal Transit Administration
